Purpose: To set up courses that meet the requirements of international certification, provide international behavioural analyst certification courses, improve individual behaviour understanding and behaviour problems, and provide high-quality teaching and counselling services

1. In 2010, the Rehabilitation Consulting Institute started the International Behavioural Analyst Certification Course ([certification link](#)), with a total of 5 relevant courses each year, with about 6–20 students taking each course. The results for 2009 are as follows:

A. A total of 5 certification courses were offered, including applied behaviour analysis (14 students), special research on emotional and behavioural problems of people with physical and mental disabilities (10 students), single-subject research method (20 students) + ethics research with applied behaviour analysis (11 students) + special research on rehabilitation counselling for people with autism (6 students).

A total of 71 students took this series of international certification courses.

B. Dr. Gabrielle Lee (working at the Western University of Canada) was invited to deliver virtual lectures for the ethics research with applied behavioural analysis course.

C. A total of four students passed the International Behavioural Analyst certification qualification examination and obtained licenses. Supporting evidence: The certification course review letter, web page, and relevant links

2. The director of the Rehabilitation Consulting Institute (Professor Feng Hua) started the International Behavioural Analyst Certification Course of transnational cooperation at the College of Extension Education. The certification course cooperates with the Department of Psychology and international experts from the University of Nevada in the United States and adopts the hybrid (long-distance virtual + group face-to-face discussion) teaching model to provide exquisite and high-quality transnational cooperation certification courses. During the opening period, from 106 to 110, a total of 2 echelon courses were opened, with 6 certification courses in each echelon, for a total of 12 courses. The results of year 109 are summarised as follows:

A. A total of five courses were offered in the 2 echelon certification courses: Behaviour intervention (second echelon, a total of 45 students), ethics and professional issues (second echelon, a total of 45 students), and language behaviour intervention (first echelon, a total of 9 students), for a total of 99 students.

B. Among them, there are two international cooperation teachers: One is Dr. Gabrielle Lee (working at Western University in Canada) and the other is lecturer

Shu-hui Ko (a doctoral student at the University of Nevada and a board certified behaviour analyst).

C. The lecturers of the group discussion also invited Dr. Shwu-Jene Tsai (University of Louisville) and Tsai Yun-Yun (Master's student, Marcus Autism Center, Georgia) to carry out international cooperation.

I Objective: To enhance the international learning and professional growth of behavioural analysis theory among relevant professionals in Taiwan.

II Course features:

- This is the only course certified by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board® Inc. (BACB) in Taiwan.
- This course is taught jointly with the Department of Psychology of the University of Nevada.
- The teaching methods are diverse, combining online learning courses and after-school group discussions (online or in the classroom). Group discussion is limited to no more than six people in each group, emphasising small-class teaching and in-depth learning.
- The lecturers and group discussion teachers are certified behavioural analysts (BCBA) and behavioural analyst doctoral license holders (BCBA-D) who have rich teaching and practical experience.
- All courses are graduate level, providing a solid theoretical foundation.
- This course also meets the certification requirements of associate behaviour analysis. It also accepts professionals studying to become associate behaviour analysts.



- III Host: Extension Education College of National Changhua University of Education
- IV Course date: September 30, 106 - August 30, 108
- V Course time: Before the weekly online group discussion of online learning, arrange the time by yourself. The online learning takes about 90 minutes. The online group discussion is one hour every Saturday, and students complete a weekly online examination.
- VI Location: Discussion room or online classroom on the third floor of the Rehabilitation Counseling Institute on the Jinde campus of the National Changhua University of Education.

- VIII. Participants:
- Applicants for BCBA must have a master's degree from a relevant department (such as the Department of Special Education, Department of Psychology, Department of Counseling, Functional Therapy, and other relevant departments).
 - To apply for BCaBA, you must have a university degree (any department). Please submit a photocopy of your diploma and a brief write-up of your academic experience.
- IX Number of participants: At least 12 people can sign up for the BCBA course. The maximum number of students is 20.
- X Tuition discount: If two people sign up for BACA, they can enjoy a 95% discount.



XI Teachers: (Introduction to the teachers of the first course)

Matthew Lewon, Ph.D., BCBA-D, graduated from the Department of Psychology of the University of Nevada, published many articles on behavioural analysis.

His research has been published in famous American journals such as Behavioral Processes, The Psychological Record, and Behavior and Philosophy. The courses he has taught include applied behaviour analysis, principles of behaviour analysis, restriction and learning, emotion, and motivation. He has published his research results at the ABAI annual meeting several times. He has rich practical experience in basic animal research and autism. He once served as the BCBA supervisor of Reno's early autism course. Areas of interest: Experimental analysis of behaviour, constraint enhancement, classical constraints, motivation, and emotion.

Shu-hui Ko, M.S., M.A., BCBA, graduated from the Rehabilitation Counseling Institute of National Changhua University of Education, and the University of Nevada where she was enrolled in the behavioural analysis program. She is currently pursuing a doctorate in behavioural analysis at the said university. She was the president of the Taiwan Association of Applied Behavior Analysis, and at present, is the editor-in-chief of the Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis in Taiwan. She has accumulated at least 17 years of practical work experience, working as a language therapist at a hospital, as a teaching team leader, and as a teaching director in ABA service institutions. She has supervised institutions in mainland China, such as Hubei Maternity and Child Health Care Hospital



and Shenzhen Autism Research Association and taught applied behaviour analysis courses. She had also supervised BCBA and BCaBA students and conducted research, the areas of interest which include the teaching of language behaviour, functional behaviour evaluation, and interventions in problematic behaviour.

XIV Registration



(I) For online registration, please go to the registration management system of the College of Extension Education. If you are registering for the first time, please apply for an account number first.

(II) Payment method: If the class is going to proceed, the organiser will uniformly send a payment note by e-mail before the class starts, notifying the payment operation. Please download and print it within the payment period and pay the registration fee at a post office, ATM, supermarket, or other channels anywhere in the country.

XIV Refund method: After completing the registration and payment, students who wish to apply for a refund for some reason should use the following method:

(I) 90% of the tuition fees paid will be refunded if students apply for a refund between the time of registration and the day the class starts.

1 / 2 of the tuition fees paid will be refunded if less than one-third of the total class-time hours are over when applying for refund from the date of class opening.

The fees will not be refunded if the class time exceeds one-third of the total hours.

(II) The paid agency fee shall be refunded in full. However, if the finished products have been purchased, the products shall be distributed.

(III) If the school fails to hold classes for some reason, the paid fees shall be refunded in full.

XV Parking method:

(I) According to the parking lot management measures of the University, student (and staff) cards can be presented for temporary parking. Preferential parking: 50% off (Jinde Campus: from 20 NTD per hour → 10 NTD per hour)

(II) Locomotive and bicycle parking permit: Please apply directly to the College of Extension Education without paying any fee.



(III) Please park your vehicle in a parking space in accordance with the regulations. Those who violate the parking rules will be dealt with in accordance with the school's campus vehicle management measures.

(I) If absences from the course total less than one-third of the total hours, trainees will be issued with a study certificate at the end of the study period.
