

1. Policy

The university provides enrollment opportunities for disadvantaged students (such as indigenous students, students with disabilities, and financially disadvantaged students):

1.1 All departments should actively provide opportunities for disadvantaged students.

- (1) Each department is encouraged to actively provide additional places for indigenous students through various channels to increase their opportunities for enrollment.
- (2) Multiple admission channels (such as dedicated admissions and screening) are provided to increase enrollment opportunities for students with disabilities.
- (3) From 2018, in order to provide comprehensive support for financially disadvantaged students (students from low-income and low-middle-income households, and families with special difficulties), the university has relaxed the admission threshold in terms of test scores for individual applicants to offer heightened opportunities to financially disadvantaged students. In addition, from 2019, the individual applications pathway launched a new admissions group (named “Yang Ying”) targeting financially disadvantaged students, with adjusted requirements for test performance and other screening criteria and a simplified screening process to increase enrollment opportunities.
- (4) In order to encourage the departments to actively provide additional places for disadvantaged students, the “Establishment of the Admission Strategy Committee and its Promotion Measures” stipulates that an award of NT\$5,000 per additionally admitted student (including overseas students, students with disabilities, and indigenous students) will be granted to the corresponding department.

1.2 Reducing application burdens for financially disadvantaged students by waiving registration fees and subsidizing transportation and accommodation costs.

- (1) Financially disadvantaged students (from low-income and low-middle-income households) who participate in the university’s self-organized admissions test are exempted from registration fees.
- (2) During the second-stage screening for individual applicants and the TVE Joint College Entrance Examination, students’ transportation and accommodation expenses are subsidized according to their place of residence on the day of the screening process by the corresponding department.
